- To treat people with kindness, dignity and respect
- To be an understanding individual
- To be open-minded to the different beliefs, opinions and actions of other individuals
- To hold yourself and your peers accountable when managing your time, activities and working as a team
- To adhere to the rules that staff and facilitators have set
- Not to resort to violence under any circumstances (<u>you will be removed from the</u> <u>session immediately</u>)
- To respect individual differences and therefore reject all forms of racism, anti-black racism, islamophobia, homophobia, transphobia, fatphobia, sexism, and ableism.

- You may asked to leave the session early
- You may not be able to attend any other Springboard session
